Wills

No one wants to write a Will that could be declared invalid when the time comes. A Will is the only way to ensure your loved ones inherit what you want them to have. It is advisable for other reasons, such as to avoid intestacy, appoint Guardians and Executors of your Will, mitigate inheritance tax or donate to a favoured charity. Above all, it gives you peace of mind.

A properly drafted Will should reduce the chance of dispute about your estate after death. Our team of specialist lawyers takes the time to talk you through each step of the process, to achieve the end result as you intend.

Inheritance Tax

The tax which applies to the value of your estate on death is known as Inheritance Tax (IHT). Its effects can be savage. Anything in your Will that is left to a spouse or charity is exempt from IHT, but otherwise tax is 40% on the value of your estate above the Nil Rate Band, which can change from time to time. If your estate is likely to exceed the Nil Rate Band, you should seek professional advice as there are many legal ways of mitigating the effects of this Tax, such as lifetime gifts, a clear Will, Trusts, and Deeds of Variation.

Estate Administration

After a loved one dies, there are many urgent duties to attend, such as registering the death, notifying authorities and ceremonial arrangements. But how are the financial affairs of the deceased to be handled? Our expert solicitors will take you through each step of Estate Administration, including the Will or intestacy, probate, income tax and inheritance tax, to help you smooth the transition after losing a loved one.

Lasting Power of Attorney

LPAs allow you to appoint another person to make decisions for you in the event you lose mental capacity. Making an LPA can be complex and it is vital to ensure the Power is completed correctly, to avoid it being declared invalid. Appointed Attorneys must follow the Code of Practice contained in the Mental Capacity Act 2005.
